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Ransom Oaks Treasure's Report 2023

As we review the financial status of the Ransom Oaks Community for the 2022 calendar year, it is clear that we are meeting all the needed expenses of our community and achieving our goal of regular contributions to the reserve fund which has been the focus of the Board for the last several years. Our present Board of Directors are committed to being highly conservative as we meet the financial challenges of today's economy. We are constantly striving to provide and maintain the assets and amenities expected in our community, and at the same time, preserve the value of our properties which make Ransom Oaks an attractive community for its residents to live, enjoy, and grow.

2022 Financial Expenditure Highlights

- Pool decks concrete repairs
- Pool sand filter repairs
- Maintenance at Greenwood Clubhouse including sewer line repair, bathroom baseboards replacement, electrical work, painted clubhouse recreation room
- Tennis court repairs at Greenwood and Eveningwood
- · Common property dead tree removal
- Purchase of additional pool furniture for Ransom Oaks pool
- Enjoyment of many community events ie. pool opening celebrations, arts and crafts, tie-dye, bike parade, movie nights, music and food truck evenings, swim team and meets, holiday celebration, and painting nights
- Pools opened and staffed for the whole summer when our area saw many private and municipal pools closed for lack of staffing

We are pleased to report that we are expecting to contribute at least the budgeted \$35,000 to our reserves this year after completing all budgeted and unexpected projects. This would bring our reserve funds to approximately \$200,000.

During this year the Board will continue to be researching and exploring all avenues of cost savings for our community and residents. A committee of Board members has been formed to research the possibility of a senior discount in the future.

As we plan to continue making contributions to the reserve fund each year, the Board has approved an increase of 2% for the 2023 calendar year. This will allow for the meeting of operational costs as well as continue to replace and maintain our present facilities. We will also be able to keep pace with inflation and add to our reserve funds. This results in the assessment changing from \$423.00 to \$431.46. The residents of Woodgate Community will see their assessment to Ransom Oaks change from \$84.00 to \$85.68. The community of Woodgate has and maintains their own pool, clubhouse, and tennis courts, but still shares in other Ransom Oaks common maintenance expenses.

2023 Budgeted Expenditure Highlights

 Pools - 2 pool heaters, 1 baby pool pump, replacement of some salt cells for chlorination system

- Club house building and equipment replacement
- Fence and gate upgrades where needed
- Playground equipment where necessary




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
