### January Board Meeting Highlights

#### Highlights from January 9, 2012 Board of Director's Meeting.

**23 residents** attended the meeting, the following issues were discussed:

- The costs to Charlesgate residents to correct the pond problem could be significantly less than hundreds of thousands of dollars.
- The Glen Oak Golf Course is cooperating to resolve the pond issue.
- Too much information is on the website.
- Can Ransom Oaks improve the courts by adding trees and rocks?
   No the Town owns the courts and has removed stones in the past.
- The Golf Course is not cooperating with Woodgate over their pond issues.
- Apparently there will be legal costs associated with the Bike Path.
- The Town is not maintaining the gas lights in the Old Oak Post Road area. They will take resident's complaints and attendance at Town Board meetings to correct this.
- The level of vulgar language and actions by golfers increases when less residents use the Bike Path.

- The board needs to strengthen its ability to enforce the Covenants and Restrictions.
- We should establish a committee to give awards for landscaping and/or other things that improve Ransom Oaks.
- Some residents are having problems posting on the Bike Path blog.
- Some adjustments have been made. Everyone should be able to at least comment.
- Can sheds be approved?

Only by changing the Covenants and Restrictions and that requires approval by 2/3 of all residents.

- Can anything be done about speeding on Old Oak Post Rd and Glen Oak Dr?
- The Board passed a resolution establishing standards for high cost procurements.
- The results of the Bike Path survey will be tabulated after February 28 when the assessments payments are due.
- We were \$1,600 over the 2011 budget of \$297,300 (0.5%).
- The sale of the Town Compost Facility to a private contractor could impact our mulch costs.
- The election was held for the three open board positions.

The two incumbents, Jim Burke and Tom Meldrum received 135 and 134 votes respectively. In addition, Mike Deck the newly appointed board member received 101 write-in votes. Three other write-in candidates received one vote each. There will be no change in board membership as a result of the election.

Dear Ransom Oaks Residents:

Recently residents of Ransom Oaks received a letter entitled "A Letter to Residents Regarding the Bike Path". The letter was signed by Pete Calinski, Secretary of Ransom Oaks Community Corporation, but was not seen by the president.

In this letter Mr. Calinski wrote, "In addition, actions by the GOGC (Glen Oak Golf Course) could cost the residents of the Charlesgate Village area of Ransom Oaks hundreds of thousands of dollars.<sup>6</sup>" The superscript 6 refers to the Buffalo News article dated December 14, 2010 and is located on the Ransom Oaks web site.

After receiving this letter, Mr. Calinski was contacted, and I spoke to the entire board at the annual meeting on January 9th. I pointed out that this statement in the letter was false, as there was no mention in the Buffalo News article which even remotely refers to any costs to the residents of Charlesgate Village. I have requested that the Ransom Oaks Board issue a retraction of the reference to Charlesgate in their letter. As of this date, no retraction has been forthcoming, nor have I been contacted. The entirely false statement concerning Charlesgate has gotten a number of our owners upset because they had not been notified of any expense, relating to the sewer issue, as large as what was in the Ransom Oaks letter. Secondly, Mr. Calinski's letter is available to anyone because the site is not password protected, and could dissuade potential buyers from purchasing homes in Charlesgate.

I hope that in the future any letter which is sent out by the Ransom Oaks board is reviewed, so that baseless statements are not presented as fact.




