Highlights from the April 16, 2012 Board of Director's Meeting.

- One resident attended the meeting.
 The resident was concerned about a section of blacktop that connects the
 Old Oak Post sidewalk to the Bike Path.
- The Town of Amherst did sewer work and did not restore the blacktop.
 Residents still using the area are tramping through the fresh ground and across resident's property.
- The Town should restore the blacktop.
 Residents are asked help convince the Town to restore the blacktop.
- A resident gave a presentation for an improved version of the Ransom Oaks web site. The board will review the prototype version.
- We are having logistics problems getting mulch for our courts.
- The gas lights should be replaced with electric versions before the end of the summer (but hopefully long before).
- Recycling totes should be delivered before May 26.
- Bike Path Survey results have been tabulated and show strong support for maintaining access to the Bike Path.

- Vandals damaged the new net at the Ransom Oaks tennis courts.
- Some houses do not have visible house numbers. This is a very dangerous situation because first responders could have difficulty locating a home. Please ensure your house number is visible from the street.
- The emerald ash borer has been found in Ransom Oaks.

We are rapidly approaching another summer season. The tennis courts are all open, the playgrounds are ready to go, and the pools will open Memorial Day weekend. We know that we have lots of work to get done before we can open the pools. Let's hope for continue warm weather.

With the warm weather fast approaching, it is important for us to take time with our family and review the rules that must be followed at each of the sites. Rules are enclosed within this newsletter. Please note that again this year we will open the Greenwood Facility at 9 o'clock every day. This should accommodate the lap swimmers and early morning sunbathers. Please note—this is not an open swim--see the activities insert of this newsletter for more information. It would also help the guards if an adult would accompany children the first few times to the pools. All children who have completed grades 1 through 3 will be required to pass a swimming test in order to be permitted in the pool area without adult accompaniment. Please sign in when you enter the pool area. Make sure you print your name and address legibly for safety concerns.

Remember you will not be able to use any of the facilities until your assessment has been paid and you have received tags. The guards have been instructed that all people in the pool area must have pool tags. Please do not give the guards a tough time when they ask to see your tags. In addition, the discussion of food/drink in the pool area has been addressed by your ROCC Board. Please remember that food needs to be consumed outside the pool area.

Let's hope for another summer of lots of beautiful weather!

Forum



We are introducing a new feature to our newsletter, called the "Resident's Forum". It is intended to provide an easy way for residents to express their interests, concerns, what pleases them or what bothers them about Ransom Oaks.

We envision it to be a series of relatively short comments. Perhaps just a sentence or two. The board often gets emails or calls about things that concern residents and they are often something that the board has no control over. We feel that if all residents could be made aware of what pleases some residents or bothers other residents we could go a long way toward enhancing all of Ransom Oaks.

To submit something for the forum any resident can call, send an email, or mail a letter to any *Board Member* or the *Newsletter Editor*. Contact information for us is in each Newsletter. We will not accept anonymous items but you can specify if you want the item to be published anonymously, with a nickname, or with your name. Typical items from the past that might have been in the Forum are:

- Barking dogs: Please don't let your dog bark for an extended period of time. It bothers all your neighbors.
- Recycling on windy days: Please do something to confine your recyclables on windy days. Sometimes the whole neighborhood is inundated by items blown from the recycling bins. (Note, this should be less of a problem when the new recycling bins are distributed).
- Thefts from vehicles: Please report these ASAP! In some cases thefts have occurred over time and if residents had been aware they could have taken more precautions. (Note we have an email network that can be used to disseminate such information very quickly.)

Please communicate your items for this Forum. The *Resident's Forum* will run as a regular feature if it works, otherwise it will be discontinued.

Garage Sale Preparation

Having a garage sale can be fun and can put some money in your pocket, but to ensure success it takes proper planning. Here are some tips for making your sale more successful:

Be clear on the purpose of your sale. Are you selling things to make money or to get rid of them? This question affects everything you do, from how you price things to how willing you are to negotiate. Surprisingly, you can often make more money (and get rid of more junk) by pricing things low. As a general rule of thumb, price items about a quarter or third of what they would cost new. There are exceptions -clothes are generally very poor sellers, unless it's baby/kids clothes.

Get cash. Get a roll of quarters, a stack of twenty-five \$1 bills, and a few \$5 bills before the day of the sale. Also, wear an apron or fanny pack to keep your money safe and your hands free.

Get Bagging Supplies. Have plastic grocery bags available to put sold items in. If selling breakables, have newspaper available to wrap fragile items.

Have a calculator handy. This is helpful in totaling up purchases. Make it easy for yourself to total items - price things evenly: .25, .50 and \$1, NOT .40, .75, \$1.20.

Prepare your staging area. People will be more inclined to stop if you set up shop in your yard or driveway. Some people are reluctant to enter a dark and dreary garage. Make your sale inviting and easy to browse. You can lure customers by placing highly-desirable items near the road. Ever notice how hard a woman has to work to convince a man to stop at a yard sale? To solve this, set out an old lawn mower or power tools out front in plain view of the road, and you'll get more business. It's also smart to set up a small table with nothing but "man-things" (jars full of screws and nails, electronic parts, tools and parts of tools, etc.). This gives the men something to immerse themselves in while the women find all the real treasures.

Have an electrical outlet handy (or a long extension cord). This will help sell your electrical appliances. Also, keep batteries on hand if necessary to test any items.



Consider a "fill a bag for a set price" kind of deal. If you have a ton of kid's clothes or small toys you are dying to get rid of, consider this. Buyers love getting a good deal. If you do something like this, just make sure you have enough bags available.

Have a pitcher of ice-water with paper cups (and trash can). On a hot day, having this available for free is a nice touch. The longer people stay at your yard sale, the more likely they will buy something. And even if they just stay and browse, that's good too since it may lure others to the sale. Nothing attracts a crowd like a crowd.

Have some background music on.

It can be a little uncomfortable to visit a garage sale (or to host one) when there's complete silence in the yard or driveway. Have easy-listening middle-of-the-road type music on. That allows customers to discuss potential purchases privately with their shopping partners, without feeling like they have to whisper.

Be prepared as some buyers will expect you to bargain with them.

If it's early in the morning and you don't want to bargain, just say "I think it's worth that price. I may lower the price later in the day if it doesn't sell.
