## May Board, Meeting Highlights

Highlights from the May14, 2012

- Two residents attended the meeting. One resident has 14 ash trees and wanted to know what is being done to combat the emerald ash borer. Basically it is everyone for themselves. Ransom Oaks will treat some on our properties and let some other trees fend for themselves. That means they will die in a few years. The second resident wants to improve a court by adding shrubs and maybe a stone, which is acceptable. Due to the upcoming loss of ash trees and Austrian pines our courts are going to experience quite a transition. Since many residents on the courts have different ideas about what to do, perhaps we should have an "Adopt-a-Court" program so those residents that have an opinion can resolve it among themselves on a case by case basis.
- We are laying the groundwork for taking legal action against those that ignore the Covenants and Restrictions.
- We are getting more and more complaints from residents about the condition of homes in Ransom Oaks.
- The Architectural Committee acted ten times in the last month.

- The audit of our 2011 financials found no problems.
- The lifeguard crew is doing a great job getting the pools ready.
- A small number of residents have not paid their 2012 assessment yet.
- The Town was able to provide us with only 50% to 70% of the mulch we usually need. We may have to purchase mulch for as much as \$1250.
- We will pay \$1149 to treat 15 ash trees at: Eveningwood (5), Old Oak Post/ Dodge (2), Smith/Glen Oak (8).



## Residents Banding Together to Save Money on Home Repairs

Improvement of our property values in Ransom Oaks has always been of interest to residents in our Community. Years ago many of us banded together to obtain a group discounted rate on surveyor provided elevation studies so that we could have our properties removed from the Federal Flood Plain (which then eliminated the requirement for bank mortgage flood insurance policies on our homes).

Some of us would like to form a group now as it applies to necessary cement repair of our sidewalks and driveway pads in order to have this property improvement done at reduced cost. The Ransom Oaks Board of Directors has given me permission to conduct a poll of interested residents who may need repair work of their sidewalks and driveway pads.

Dependent on the number of residents who would like to join our group, we would solicit cement contractors that would be interested in offering a group discount for this repair work. The larger the number of residents who will join our group, the larger would be the group discount available. **The more residents who then** have necessary repair work completed, the greater the increase in community property values that will result.

Once our group is established, I will make contact with a few cement contractors who would be willing to offer a Ransom Oaks discount and guarantee on their repair work.

There is **no obligation** in joining our group of interested residents.

If you have interest, please provide me with your name, address, phone number and specify whether you are in need of sidewalk or driveway pad (or both) repair work. Judging by the large number of cracked cement areas particularly on older properties, if we could get just half of these residents to join our group, the discount that could be achieved would be considerable.

## 10 Ways to Add Curb Appeal

#### Create an instant garden

Container gardens add a welcoming feel and colorful appeal to any home exterior -- quickly and affordably. You can buy ready-made containers from garden centers or create your own with your favorite plants. For most landscapes, a staggered, asymmetrical arrangement works best to create a dynamic setting.

#### **Renew planter beds**

Get garden beds into shape by pruning growth, pulling weeds, planting flowers, and adding new mulch to restore color that was taken away by sunlight and harsh weather. If stone or brick borders your bed, consider cleaning and resetting any pieces that are soiled or dislodged. If your border is old or tired-looking, try upgrading to stone or a decorative cast-concrete edging system.





#### Install window boxes

Window boxes offer a fast, easy way to bring color and charm to your home exterior. Choose boxes made from copper or iron for a traditional look, or painted wood for a cottage feel. Mix and match flowers and plants to suit your lighting conditions and color scheme.

#### Add outdoor art

Give your yard a little spunk by adding weather-resistant artwork. Choose pieces that complement your home's natural palette and exterior elements. Birdbaths, metal cutouts, sculptures, and wind chimes are good choices for outdoor art.

#### Build a walkway

Well-designed walkways make your home feel warm and inviting. For a dramatic improvement to a straight concrete path, replace it with a contoured one made of stone or brick. For a less radical upgrade, apply a colored concrete resurfacer to the old walkway, then edge with brick or stone borders. Brick pavers offer traditional, classic beauty to the landscape of any home.

### Renew paint, siding, and trim

An exterior facelift (new paint, siding, or trim details) automatically transforms the look of a home. Periodic maintenance of that exterior surface is the surest way to keep your house looking its best. Any obvious defects, such as cracked or rotting material, can downgrade the curb appeal and quickly turn away potential homebuyers. Once defects are repaired, look for ways to add personality with color, trim, or shingles.

## **Take Action Now, Prep House for Spring Storms**

Homeowners should do what they can now to protect their home and property from the violent spring storms that are certain to roar through New York this year. A few precautions may ease some stress if and when that storm hits and you need help. Plan ahead by taking the time to prepare an emergency kit, trim shrubs and trees, and identify a safe place to take shelter before a spring storm hits.

These tips on damage prevention and homeowner's insurance coverage are meant to help you make decisions that may reduce your risks. We don't know every risk and cannot guarantee these will work for you, but some of them may help protect your most valuable assets – you and your family.

#### Things to consider doing outside your home to protect it from severe weather damage:

- Keep trees and shrubs trimmed. Weak branches could fall on your neighbor's home.
- Clear drains, gutters and downspouts of debris to prevent drains from breaking during heavy rains and water flooding into your home.
- Extend and re-direct the downspouts close to your home to move the water away.
- If storms are forecast, secure lawn furniture and other that could be moved by strong winds.

#### Things to consider doing inside your home to protect against flooding:

- Install a sump pump with a battery back-up system.
- If you have a sump pump, test it now.
- Caulk cracks on the interior where you may have seen water in the past.
- Store area rugs and carpeting on higher floors to reduce the chances of rugs getting wet and growing mold.
- Move furniture and electronics off the basement floor.

#### Safety Tips for you and your family:

• Put together an emergency kit – flashlight, batteries, weather all-hazard radio, first aid supplies, air horn, basic tools, extra car keys, extra eyeglasses.

#### Protect your personal property:

- Inventory your valuables, including approximate value, and date purchased.
- Pictures or videos are great. Go to www.KnowYourStuff.org for more information and download free software.
- Store mortgage and other important papers in a safe deposit or fire safe box – do not store the box on your basement floor.
- Add your insurance company's claims number to Contacts on your cell phone.
- · Read and understand your homeowner and auto insurance policies, especially your deductibles. Talk to an agent to make sure you have the appropriate amount of insurance coverage to protect what matters to you.
- Consider buying flood insurance. Most homeowner insurance policies don't cover flooding. Specialized flood coverage through FEMA's National Flood Insurance Program is available to most homeowners. Many local insurance agents can help you acquire flood insurance. Make sure to consider buying flood insurance coverage before the heavy flooding season because in most cases the policies take effect 30 days after purchase.
