School will be out shortly, and we will be beginning another summer of activities at the facilities. The activities that begin in June are as follows: (Please note that activities are for the residents of Ransom Oaks only.)

First session of swimming lesson begins Monday, June 3rd. Please talk to guards for more information or refer to the seasonal insert in the May newsletter. Session Two begins June 24th.

Pre-school Fun Day: Tuesday, June 18th. Please sign up at the Ransom Oaks pool. \$10/child includes—snacks, games etc. Time: 10-12.

Imagination Station: Begins June 24th at the Eveningwood site—EVERY DAY!

Art/crafts, organized fun for children of all ages. Participants must have a Recreation Card. Information is listed in this newsletter or you can go to the Town of Amherst Recreation website for more information.

T-Shirt Day: Wednesday, June will begin June 28th. Come and join the fun! Staff will begin at Ransom Oaks from 11:00-12:30, Eveningwood from 1:00-2:30 and Greenwood from 3:00-4:30. Watch for signs with more details at the pools.

Tennis: Courts are open and ready for you and your friends.

This is just the beginning of things that will be going on. Visit the pools for more information as well as postings of things happening around the community. It promises to be a wild summer as usual!

We would like to welcome all the guards back for another season. This year, there is some switching, but many of the same faces! Please give all our lifeguards a fair chance. We are very lucky to have a dedicated staff!

Lifeguards have been instructed to ask all residents for pool tags and instruct residents to print their names and addresses clearly for safety purposes. Please keep your tags in your possession. Please review all pool rules before using the facilities. Please be aware that there is no eating/drinking in the pool area; this will be strictly enforced. Residents who continually break the rules will be asked to leave the area. Please do not give the guards a difficult time about this procedure. They are doing what they have been instructed to do by the Ransom Oaks Board of Directors.

Don't forget pool tags must be worn when using any of the facilities this includes the tennis courts. Guards have been instructed to ask to see tags if there are any problems.

If you have not paid your assessment fee, it will be turned over to the attorney mid-June. It is important that you contact us and make arrangements for payment. You cannot use any of the facilities until you have received pool tags.

Children "hanging" at facilities after hours, continues to be a problem. Please contact the Amherst police if you see anyone at the facilities after the posted

REMINDER

As facilities managers' dealing with vandalism seems to be increasing each year. This is very costly to the residents of Ransom Oaks and frustrating to us. With this in mind, we need the help of the entire community. Call the Amherst police if you see people hanging around the facilities after hours. Everyone has a vested interest in the community. Ransom Oaks is a great neighborhood with so much to offer. Let's work together to stop this escalating situation. As a final reminder, facilities are closed from 9 pm until 8 am. ■

Do You Know Where Your Totes are as of 5/21/13?

As a community that collectively cares about the appearance and values of our homes we had hoped that residents would follow the Covenants and Restrictions which require that garbage (and by implication recycling) containers should not be visible except on the day that pickup is made. All residents are not complying with the C&R.

We decided to tabulate just how many residents conformed to the C&R. To do this we divided the single family homes of Ransom Oaks into 16 Zones and counted totes that are visible from the street in each Zone. Note, we did not attempt to find totes that were visible from other vantage points.

The totes were counted monthly for the last nine months. The results are shown in the table below.

Apparently we have reached the point of diminishing returns on this process. **Twelve** more homes are **no longer hiding** there totes as required by the C&R. We are down from a high of **75%** compliance to **71%**. We are sure this is very disappointing to all the residents that complimented this effort. And more disappointing to those of you that want us to take stronger action.

Well, it is time **for you** to help. Nearly **400** homes seem to have mastered the task of keeping their totes inside. Perhaps it is a matter of odor. How do you **400** deal with the odor issue? Last month a resident said moth balls work. Also, Arm and Hammer sells a Trash Can and Dumpster Deodorizer.

Another aspect of this issue is many residents seem to think visible totes are not a problem. They feel their

neighbors don't mind. It is only the "grumpy old board" that has a problem with visible totes. Well, you **400** should take this opportunity to **send a message** to your neighbors that **visible totes are a problem to you also**. If you don't feel comfortable addressing them directly, **make a copy of this article and mail it to them**. We can solve this problem by working together. But the Board can't do it alone.

If you have internet access you can get the full spreadsheet showing the actual addresses that are in each Zone and the status of each on the day we made the count. It is on our new website at **www.RansomOaks.com**. You will have to register to access this area of

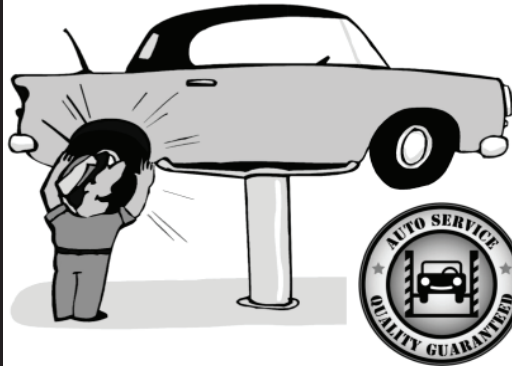
