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Board of Director's Meeting Highlights

June 13, 2013

- One resident attended the meeting to question the process followed for enforcing the Covenants and Restrictions via legal actions. The processes being followed are the same as have been in place since the founding of Ransom Oaks.
- The Town of Amherst will be enforcing the Town Code regarding refuse containers.
- Online payments for assessments and advertising are a possibility in the future but the additional costs will have to be covered by the payers.
- We are about \$24,000 below budget YTD. It is primarily due to start up of repair and improvement tasks.
- Repairs to the tennis courts at the Greenwood Recreation Center should start soon.
- There is an open position on the Board.

Town of Amherst Enforcement of the Code Involving Totes

The Town will be enforcing Section #169-16.B of the Town Code. The complete text of the Code is available on the Town website. Briefly, it requires all garbage and refuse containers be kept inside the dwelling or if outside, behind the rear line of the building.

In the process of complying with the Town of Amherst Code, residents should also comply with the Section 9.10 of the Ransom Oaks Declaration of Protective Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions which requires that except for the day of pick up, all containers cannot be seen from adjacent and surrounding property. The full text of the section is in the documents provided to residents at the time the property was purchased and on the Ransom Oaks. Website under the Living In section.

Amherst Housing Market

Seeing lots of for sale signs lately? Wondering what's happening in our area? Here is a basic summary of the **Amherst Real Estate Market:**


The median sale price for homes in Amherst over the last 12 months is \$164,062. Our average of sales in Ransom Oaks tends to be slightly higher, approximately \$200,000 for the last 12 months.

The median mortgage debt in Amherst is \$92,300.

Amherst, NY Property Ownership



The percent of unoccupied properties is very low in Amherst. It is -10.5% below the national average.

Amherst, NY Price Trends - Sold vs. Listed

Understand the difference between "listing prices" (what sellers are asking for) and "sold prices" (what buyers are willing to pay).





By comparing these price trends, you'll have a good idea of where the market is heading. The median listing and sold property prices are calculated based on the market activity each month.

Some sales are not immediately available from public records. As they become available, the data are updated.

Amherst, NY Market Inventory Trends

The number of active listings in Amherst increased by **12.8%** from the previous month.

The median number of days active properties have been listed is **33**. This is significantly shorter than the national average. Low interest rates plus shortage of home inventory has decreased the number of days most properties remain on the market.

Do You Know Where Your Totes are as of 6/18/13?

As a community that collectively cares about the appearance and values of our homes we had hoped that residents would follow the Covenants and Restrictions which require that garbage (and by implication recycling) containers should not be visible except on the day that pickup is made. All residents are not complying with the C&R.

We decided to tabulate just how many residents conformed to the C&R. To do this we divided the single family homes of Ransom Oaks into 16 Zones and counted totes that are visible from the street in each Zone. Note, we did not attempt to find totes that were visible from other vantage points.

The totes were counted monthly for the last ten months. The results are shown in the table below. Again this month more totes were visible. Only two more visible verses nearly 400 hidden totes but that is still an increase.

It is interesting that you can find areas where one home has their totes out front while the homes on either side and across the street are hiding their totes. So the culprit has a beautiful view, free of totes while all those neighbors that hide their totes have their view ruined by that one home.

You can also find some areas where a lot of totes are displayed. A visitor would think they have stumbled upon a patch of giant blue mushrooms. Hopefully no one in those areas is trying to sell their home.

Again, you 400 should take this opportunity to send a message to your

neighbors that visible totes are a problem for you. If you don't feel comfortable addressing them directly, make a copy of this article and mail it to them. We can solve this problem by working together. But the Board can't do it alone.

If you have internet access you can get the full spreadsheet showing the actual addresses that are in each Zone and the status of each on the day we made the count. It is on our new website at www.RansomOaks.com. You will have to register to access this area of the site. Registration is free. After you
