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Exterior Modification Application (EMA)

Included with the September 2013 issue of the Ransom Oaks Newsletter was an insert titled, Ransom Oaks Community Corporation (ROCC), Exterior Modification Application (EMA) with Instructions for Completion of EMA. The EMA and Instructions are intended to assist single family homeowners with planned maintenance and improvement projects involving the exteriors of their homes and yards. The EMA will assist in assuring planned projects are approved by the ROCC Architectural Committee, consistent with the ROCC Declaration of Protective Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions (Declaration). Additionally, EMA completion and Architectural Committee approval is intended to prevent an owner from doing something possibly outrageous and inconsistent with the ROCC Declaration.

such improvements. The benefits
are aesthetic and financial, as a well
maintained property will support a

Board of Director's Meeting Highlights

September 9, 2013

- Three residents attended the meeting:
 - They had many comments and suggestions about pool and facilities maintenance and improvements.
 - They would also like to see more community wide events and will try to arrange some.
- Members of the Board will be meeting with the Town to better understand the drainage problems
- Apparently some residents have received notices from the Town of Amherst that their sidewalks do not meet Town standards and must be repaired.
- We have added more procedures to improve our accounting methods as advised during the 2012 audit. No irregularities were found during that audit.
- We are about \$15,000 under budget due to delays in capital spending and lower gas costs.
- The pools are closed. This was a very safe season.
- Liens for non-payment of assessments will go out soon.

Do You Know Where Your Totes are as of 9/17/13?

As a community that collectively cares about the appearance and values of our homes we had hoped that residents would follow the Covenants and Restrictions which require that garbage (and by implication recycling) containers should not be visible except on the day that pickup is made. All residents are not complying with the C&R.

We decided to tabulate just how many residents conformed to the C&R. To do this we divided the single family homes of Ransom Oaks into 16 Zones and counted totes that are visible from the street in each Zone. Note, we did not attempt to find totes that were visible from other vantage points.

The totes were counted monthly for the last thirteen months. The results are shown in Table 1 below. This month we stayed essentially constant at 73%. We have over 400 homes that follow the C&R and less than 150 that still choose to ignore the rules.



Many residents have found alternatives so that totes and other items such as ladders, lumber, small trailers, wheelbarrows, etc. can be stored in their garage.

If you have internet access you can get the full spreadsheet showing the actual addresses that are in each Zone and the status of each on the day we made the count. It is on our website at www.ransomoaks.com. You will

have to register to access this area of the site. Registration is free. After you register another link will appear on the top menu, to the right of "Contact", with the title "Residents". There you will be able to access our forum, tote information and Bike Path documents.

If you prefer to examine a hard copy of the file, contact the secretary of the Ransom Oaks Community Corporation.

Around Home

4 Things Buyers Love and Sellers Sometime Fail to Mention

In Real Estate, we often use the term "under market" to describe a home that is priced or purchased for less than its fair market value. Sometimes we see an unrelated real estate phenomenon that perhaps Webster would rank as a second definition for "undermarketing": to list a home and fail to mention features the homes have, which buyers would have been attracted to, had they seen them in the home's listing description, flyer or online marketing.

If your home has commercial-grade European appliances, sits on a beautiful piece of land, or is has a \$50,000 updated kitchen, it's pretty easy to know what to lead with in your marketing. But if you have a normal house in a normal neighborhood, there could very well be things you take for granted which a first-time or relocating buyer might be magnetically drawn to – if you mention it in the listing.

Storage. When aiming to avoid undermarketing, keep this in mind: showcasing your home in its best light is not just about what you love about it. You might already have outgrown the place, and started to see its flaws more than its finer points: that's why you're moving. But the goal of good marketing is to highlight the things that will allow your home to shine in the eyes of your target buyers and against the competition.

Organizing systems. In the same vein, if you have made the investment in upgrading your home with customized or built-in closet, kitchen or garage organizer systems, desks or bookshelves make sure buyers see and know this from your home's online listing. From the first-timer craving to have a clutter-free existence to buyers who are moving up into a family home and want each family member's space to have at least the possibility of order, built-in organizers can represent value and appeal to a wide range of prospective buyers.

Proximity. You might be thinking the right buyers for your home will be finding it online precisely because of where it's located, so it's silly to call out the property's proximity to amenities and attractions. Not so fast. First, some buyers simply might not know to search for your zip code, or might not be aware that your hidden gem of a neighborhood also happens to have amenities like pool, tennis or playgrounds. Relocating buyers might not have the core knowledge of the area that would allow them to connect the dots about the property based on location basics you are assuming everyone in the market for a home like yours will know. Don't assume: if your home is particularly well-located vis-a-vis major employers, universities,





recreational amenities or walkable shopping and dining districts showcase this in your listing.

Senior-friendly features. Boomers are not necessarily looking for homes with built-in disability features, but they are often looking for homes they could live in for the rest of their lives, "aging in-place," without necessarily being located in senioronly communities. That means homes with level-in entrances (no stairs to the front door), single story layouts and low-maintenance landscaping have a massive new audience attracted to these features which would otherwise not warrant a mention in a home's marketing, especially if homes near yours tend to have loads of stairs or other features that are difficult for people to navigate as they age.

Similarly, the movement toward aging-in-place has caused many more families to move aging relatives in with them, versus moving them out to retirement homes. These extended families often are looking for homes with a very well-appointed "mother-in-law" or "outlaw" units or a second master suite located on the home's ground floor. If your home has multiple bedrooms with bathrooms en suite or completely independent living quarters, marketing these features to extended families is a must.
