Wednesday Sit on Your Front Porch Night Updates

We'll resume our Wednesday

Front Porch nights when the warm weather returns.

Do You Know Where Your Totes are as of 10/16/13?

As a community that collectively cares about the appearance and values of our homes we had hoped that residents would follow the Covenants and Restrictions which require that refuse (and by implication recycling) containers should not be visible except on the day that pickup is made. Not all residents are complying with the C&R.

We decided to tabulate just how many residents are complying. To do this we divided the single family homes of Ransom Oaks into 16 Zones and counted totes that are visible from the street in each Zone. Note, we did not attempt to find totes that were visible from other vantage points.

The totes were counted monthly for the last fourteen months. The results are shown in the graph below.

This month we stayed essentially constant at 73% as we have for the past four months. In looking back over the past fourteen months one thing that stands out is the Zones around the Ransom Oaks Recreation Area have consistently been the best. Zone 5 which includes Fiddler's Green, Inverness Court, Oakhill Court and a section of Ransom Oaks Drive and Zone 6 which consists of Pinehurst Court, Sweetwater Court, and sections of Ransom Oaks and Glen Oak Drives in that



area have each been the leaders for five of the fourteen months. And Zone 8, Oakcliff Court, Redbud Court, and the section of Glen Oak Drive between those courts was the best the four other times. These folks have always exceeded 80% compliance. Once reaching 90% last February.

And then there is poor Zone 16. Ruby Lane and the section of Glen Oak Drive from Topaz Court to the Glen Oak Playground. They have been in last place for thirteen of the fourteen months. Taking even a closer look, on Ruby Lane, only two of the ten homes leave out their totes consistently. The other eight hide theirs so Ruby Lane scores an 80%. But the Glen Oak Drive part of Zone 16 consists of fifteen homes, only five of which hid their totes this month. That is only 33%.



RansomOaks.com. You will have to register to access this area of the site. Registration is free. After you register another link will appear on the top menu, to the right of "Contact" with the title "Residents". There you will be able to access our forum, tote information and Bike Path documents.

Around Home Winterizing Your Home

You'll get a season's worth of savings and peace of mind by taking a few steps in the fall to get



your home ready for cold weather.

Here are 10 easy tips:

1. Clean those gutters. As you're hosing out your gutters, look for leaks and misaligned pipes.

2. Block those leaks. One of the best ways to winterize your home is to simply block obvious leaks around your house, both inside and out, experts say.

3. Insulate yourself. Another thing that does cost a little money -- but you do get the money back quick -- is adding attic insulation.

4. Check the furnace. Be sure it's working properly and change the furnace filters regularly.

5. Get your ducts in a row. According to the U.S. Department of Energy, a home with central heating can lose up to 60% of its heated air before that air reaches the vents if ductwork is not well-connected and insulated, or if it must travel through unheated spaces.

6. Face your windows. Replace the screens with storms. Buy a window insulator kit to take care of any leaks.

7. Check the chimney before your first fire. Be sure it's clear. Call a local chimney sweep if necessary.

8. Reverse that fan to push warm air into the room. (You know the fan is ready for winter: As you look up, the blades should be turning clockwise.

9. Check those pipes. Turn off the water to your outside hose bibs to keep from freezing. Check any pipes in uninsulated areas.

10. Finally, check those alarms. Check & change the batteries your smoke & carbon monoxide alarms.


