

Ransom Oaks Garage Sale Tips

Ten tips for a successful sale:

- 1. A group sale is better then selling alone. A larger sale, more homes, draws more traffic.
- 2. Advertise in local papers the week before your sale.
- 3. Be prepared. Be ready to go the night before so that you don't have to rush around in the morning and are ready for the early birds.
- 4. Plan your sale layout with customers in mind. Consider where you are placing items to draw people into the back and for easy sale & removal of large items.
- 5. Price things carefully, but remember why you're having a sale. Bundle smaller items.
- 6. Label things well. Make it easy to buy.
- 7. Be friendly. Greet people as they arrive chat if they're chatty.
- 8. Do not bad-mouth your items.
- 9. Be willing to bargain, but be less flexible at the start. The bargaining is much of the fun for some customers.
- 10. Do not use a cash box unless there is someone to watch it. Keep your money on you at all times.

11 Earth Day Facts

- 1. The first Earth Day was celebrated on April 22, 1970.
- 2. Earth Day originated in the US but became recognized worldwide by 1990.
- 3. On Earth Day 2009, Disney released a documentary film called Earth that followed the migration paths of four animal families.
- 4. On the very first Earth Day, 20 million people gathered in the streets of America to protest the industrial revolution. An environmental movement was born as a result.
- Every year on April 22, men, women, and children collect garbage, plant trees, clean up coral reefs, show movies, sign petitions, and plan for a better future for our planet.
- 6. Gaylord Nelson founded Earth Day while he was working as a US senator.
- 7. Earth Day was renamed officially by the UN in 2009 as International Mother Earth Day.
- 8. Some schools and communities celebrate Earth Day for a whole week to expand the time frame that people focus on the earth and how they can preserve it.
- 9. On Earth Day 2012, more than 100,000 people rode bikes in China to reduce CO2 emissions and save fuel.
- In an Earth Day celebration in 2011, 28 million trees were planted in Afghanistan by the Earth Day Network.
- 11. In Panama, 100 endangered species of orchids were planted and maintained to prevent their extinction in honor of Earth Day.

Getting into the Garden

Although the last frost is still about a month away, it's time to get a start on your garden for this year.

Can't wait to get your hands dirty? It's time to start cleaning out the beds from winter, adding compost to the soil, and planning your garden for this year.

If you're a container gardener, it's time to get your pots cleaned and dirt prepared.

Most years, Mother's Day is a safe target for planting outdoors.



Six things you should know when planting a tree.



1. Call Before You Dig – Several days before planting, call the national 811 hotline to have underground utilities located.

2. Handle with Care - Always lift tree by the root ball. Keep roots moist until planting.

3. Digging a Proper Hole - Dig 2 to 5 times wider than the diameter of the root ball with sloping sides to allow for proper root growth.

4. Planting Depth – The trunk flare should sit slightly above ground level and the topmost roots should be buried 1 to 2 inches.

 Filling the Hole - Backfill with native soil unless it's all clay. Tamp in soil gently to fill large air spaces.

6. **Mulch** - Allow 1 to 2 inch clearance between the trunk and the mulch. Mulch should be 2 to 3 inches deep.
