

Selling Your Ransom Oaks Home?

When you place your home for sale, be sure to contact our Facilities Managers, Tom & Kathy Halter(tkhalter@ransomoaks.com, 716-691-7352), at least 10 days before your closing date.

Here's an excerpt from our letter describing the seller's responsibilities in the sale of a Ransom Oaks residence.

... Ransom Oaks is a planned community controlled by a set of rules and covenants that are filed with the Attorney General of the State of New York. It is necessary for you, the seller, to ensure the following documents are made available to the buyer at closing:

- A) Copy of the most current Ransom Oaks Covenants and Restrictions
- B) Certificate of Compliance issued by Ransom Oaks Architecture Committee
- C) Copy of the most current Certificate of Assessment, confirming that all your ROCC annual assessments have been paid in full and there are no arrears for any year

It is important for you to understand that the buyer's lawyer will require these documents for the closing to proceed. Please do not ignore this letter because it can negatively affect your ability to close on the sale of your property

Rest assured your responsibility in this matter is very simple and requires little effort. Forward this letter to your real estate attorney and ask them to contact the individual below as soon as your property is sold and a closing date has been set. We will then perform an exterior inspection to insure that your home and property are in compliance with all current covenants and restrictions. Once the inspection has been performed and your property is deemed to be in compliance and all assessments are up to date, we will forward the required documents to your attorney, who in turn will make them available to the purchaser at the closing. ...

A few moments reading with the kids, or playing a new game. Enjoy a walk with your dog.


Share breakfast with your Sweetheart. Doesn't have to be anything fancy, but it is Saturday!

Presidents' Day

In 1879, President Rutherford B. Hayes signed the bill making February 22 a federal holiday to commemorate the birthday of George Washington. The holiday was moved in 1971 to the third Monday in February. In many states the holiday has evolved into an homage to all American presidents.

George Washington lived from 1732 to 1799 and was president for two terms, from 1789 to 1793, and 1793 to 1797.

Abraham Lincoln's birthday falls close to George Washington's but his is not a federal holiday. Many states still celebrate his birthday along with George Washington's.

George Washington is featured on the quarter dollar coin and the one dollar bill.

Since 1888, George Washington's Farewell Address has been read in the senate on February 22nd of most years.

Some spell it President's Day and some spell it Presidents' Day. Presidents' Day refers to more than one president while President's Day refers to one President. The difference in spelling may be because some celebrate George Washington alone on this day and others celebrate George and Abraham Lincoln, while some may be celebrating all presidents.

Even though it is a federal holiday, each state is free to call it what they choose and celebrate as they decide.

There were four presidents born in February including George Washington, Abraham Lincoln, William Harrison and Ronald Reagan. Most celebrate Presidents' Day in honor of the first two. source: http://www.softschools.com

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
Car Corner Did you know? ...
