
Did you know? ...

Ways to stretch your gas dollar.

- Observe the speed limit. Mileage decreases above 50 mph.
- Avoid excessive idling. Warming up your vehicle for one or two minutes, if at all is sufficient.
- Avoid quick starts and stops.
 Aggressive driving can lower gas mileage with sudden starts and stops.
- Consolidate trips. Several short trips taken from a cold start can use twice as much gas as one longer multi-stop trip.
