
We are also in the process of making sure we have current addresses for everyone in the community. If you would like to have your assessment notice forwarded to a different address, please drop us a line or give us a call.



## **Proxy & Ballot**

Again this year we will continue the random drawing we initiated in 2005. A single proxy/ballot will be drawn and the winner will have their 2016 annual assessment waived (amount not to exceed the amount of the 2016 assessment). All valid proxy/ballots received prior to the start of the Annual General Meeting (AGM) will be eligible. Members of the ROCC Board of Directors are not eligible for this drawing.

If you are a property owner in Ransom Oaks, have paid all assessments and have no outstanding liens against your property you can cast your vote in one of two ways.

- 1. Attend the AGM with proper identification and deposit the enclosed Ballot (or one provided at the meeting) in the Ballot box.
- 2. Vote by Proxy: Complete the enclosed Proxy form, either assigned to someone or left to the recording secretary.

Vote for the candidate(s) of your choice or leave the Ballot blank. Separate the Proxy from the Ballot and fold over and staple the Ballot for privacy.



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
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
