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Ransom Oaks Board Meeting Highlights

March 14, 2016

- No residents attended the meeting.
- We are within \$1,700 of the planned budget.
- Pool and Tennis rules were approved. We will arrange for Pickle Ball to be played at one of the courts. It will be lined for both Tennis and Pickle Ball.
- We will engage a professional pool company to perform a preseason check of our systems.
- We are testing another method of collecting delinquent assessments.
- 225 residents out of 1127 have not paid their 2016 assessments by the due date of February 29. They will be subject to a late charge and interest.
- The Ransom Oaks Meeting Room remodeling program has been completed for a cost of \$24,600 which was considerably less than the first proposals.
- The Greenwood pool will be resurfaced before the 2016 season.
- 12 lifeguards from last year have been invited back. There may be a need to hire additional lifeguards. An application can be made via our website at http://ransomoaks. com/openings.

In 1970, San Francisco activist John McConnell and Wisconsin Senator Gaylord Nelson separately asked Americans to join in a grassroots demonstration. McConnell chose the spring equinox (March 21, 1970) and Nelson chose April 22. Millions of people participated, and today Earth Day continues to be widely celebrated with events on both dates.

The most common practice of celebration is to plant new trees for Earth Day.
