Around Home Healthy New Year's Resolutions

New Year's resolutions are fun to make but extremely difficult to maintain. Each January, roughly one in three Americans resolve to better themselves in some way. A much smaller percentage of people actually make good on those resolutions. While about 75% of people stick to their goals for at least a week, less than half (46%) are still on target six months later, a 2002 study found.

It's hard to keep up the enthusiasm months after you've swept up the confetti, but it's not impossible. This year, pick one of the following worthy resolutions, and stick with it. Here's to your health!

Stay in touch

Feel like old friends (or family) have fallen by the wayside? It's good for your health to reconnect with them. Research suggests people with strong social ties live longer than those who don't.

In fact, a lack of social bonds can damage your health as much as alcohol abuse and smoking, and even more than obesity and lack of exercise, a 2010 study in the journal PLoS Medicine suggests.

In a technology-fixated era, it's never been easier to stay in touch—or rejuvenate your relationship—with friends and family, so fire up Facebook and follow up with in-person visits.

Get more sleep

You probably already know that a good night's rest can do wonders for your mood—and appearance. But sleep is more beneficial to your health than you might realize.

A lack of sleep has been linked to a greater risk of obesity and type 2 diabetes. And sleep is crucial for strengthening memories (a process called consolidation).

So take a nap—and don't feel guilty about it.

Travel

The joys and rewards of vacations can last long after the suitcase is put away. "We can often get stuck in a rut, and we can't get out of our own way," Kanaris says. "Everything becomes familiar and too routine."

But traveling allows us to tap into life as an adventure, and we can make changes in our lives without having to do anything too bold or dramatic.

"It makes you feel rejuvenated and replenished," he adds. "It gets you out of your typical scenery, and the effects are revitalizing. It's another form of new discovery and learning, and great for the body and the soul."

New York State Sheriffs Association Yellow Dot Program

Yellow Dot is a free program designed to help first responders provide life-saving medical attention during that first "golden hour" after a crash or other emergency. A Yellow Dot in the driver's-side rear window of your vehicle will alert first responders that vital medical information is stored in the glove compartment.

How Yellow Dot Works

The Yellow Dot kit contains a personal information card and a Yellow Dot decal.

1. Complete both sides of the personal information card as fully as possible, in pencil. Attach a recent photo of yourself and place it in a visible location in your car's glove compartment.

2. Complete one card for each person who regularly occupies the vehicle. See below to request additional medical information forms.

3. Place the Yellow Dot decal on the rear driver's side window to alert first responders to look in the glove compartment for your medical information.

4. Update the card annually yourself or bring it to your annual medical check-up. If you sell your car, remove the Yellow Dot sticker.

Use Yellow Dot at Home

A Yellow Dot kit can also be used to alert those who respond to an emergency in your home. Simply place a Yellow Dot decal on or beside your front door and place a completed card for each occupant in a clear plastic freezer bag and place in a visible location in the freezer compartment of your refrigerator.

For Homeowners

The Town of Amherst Building Department would like to remind all residents to *be aware of unscrupulous contractors* that approach homeowners with propositions to perform repair work that is not necessary.

The Town of Amherst Building Department has a Home Improvement **Contractor Registration Program to** insure the legitimacy of a contractor who performs home improvement construction(such as porches, decks, additions, plumbing and electrical work), repairs (such as roofing and siding), as well as other construction related activities. This program serves to verify that the registered contractor is properly insured. It further identifies the responsible person or people who operate the specific contracting business. A list of the registered Home Improvement Contractors can be viewed on the Town of Amherst website, www. amherst.ny.us.

Protecting From the "Grandparent Scam"

You get a call or an email unexpectedly from someone who claims to be a friend or relative. *This often happens to grandparents with the caller claiming to be their grandson or granddaughter*. The caller says there's an emergency and asks you to send money immediately. But beware, *there's a good chance this is an imposter trying to steal your money!* Follow these tips to avoid becoming a victim of fraud.

• How do these scammers choose you to contact? Sometimes they contact people randomly. They also use marketing lists, telephone listings, and information from social networking sites, obituaries and other sources. Sometimes they hack into people's email accounts and send messages to everyone in their contact list.

• How do these scammers know the names of your friends or relatives? In some cases they don't. For instance, the scammer may say "Hi grandma," hoping that you actually have a grandson. If you ask, "David, is that you?" the scammer will say "Yes!" Often these crooks will call in the middle of the night and take advantage of the fact that you may not be awake enough to ask more questions and you may not want to disturb other people by calling them to confirm the information. Sometimes the scammers do know the names of your friends or relatives. They can get that information from a variety of sources. Your relatives may be mentioned in an obituary or on a social networking site. Your email contact list may contain the names of friends and relatives.

• What do these scammers usually say? They might say something like, "I'm in Canada and I'm trying to get home but my car broke down and I need money right away to get it fixed." Or they may claim to have been mugged, or been in a car accident, or need money for bail or to pay customs fees to get back into the United States from another country. They may also pose as an attorney or law enforcement official contacting you on behalf of a friend or relative. No matter the story, they always want you to send money immediately.

• If you realize you've been scammed, what can you do? These scammers ask you to send money through services such as Western Union and MoneyGram because they can pick it up quickly, in cash. They often use phony IDs, so it's impossible to trace them. Contact the money transfer service immediately to report the scam. If the money hasn't been picked up yet, you can retrieve it, but if it has, it's not like a check that you can stop – the money is gone.

• How can you protect your email account from being used by scammers? Use a firewall and antivirus and anti-spyware software. Many computers come with these features already built-in. They are also easy to find on the Internet. Keep your software updated. Don't open attachments in emails from strangers, since they can contain programs that enable crooks to get into your computer remotely.

 What else can you do to protect yourself? If you get a call or email from someone claiming to know you and asking for help, check to confirm that it's legitimate before you send any money. Ask some questions that would be hard for an imposter to answer correctly – the name of the person's pet, for example, or the date of their mother's birthday. Contact the person who they claim to be directly. If you can't reach the person, contact someone else - a friend or relative of the person. 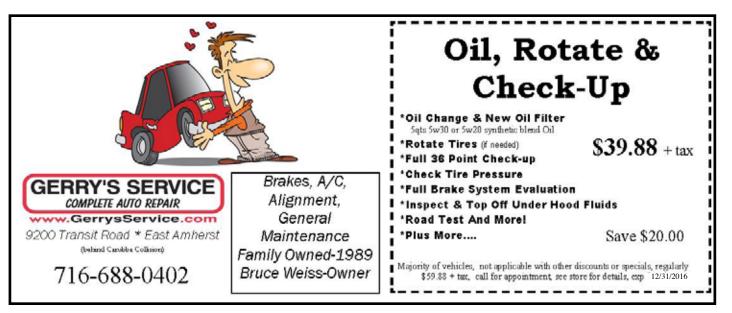
