This early spring has us excited with warm weather plans in the works.

We are currently in the process of contacting our life guarding staff from last year to see who will be interested in returning to work for the community. This is the time you should be getting certified to become a lifeguard. Please go to http://www.ransomoaks.com/openings to complete & submit the application. Please remember that all life guards must be certified by May. At this time, we do not know how many openings we will have, but all applications will be kept on file.

Assessment notices were due by March 1st. You can expect a late notice in early March if you have not paid this year's assessment. Please remember this assessment is for the calendar year of 2016 and mandatory for all ROCC residents. At this point, all assessments must be paid by mail, not online. Please note that we will not send pool passes to residents with unpaid service charges or liens on their property.

Lastly, all building rentals are handled by contacting us at 691-7352. Please do not call after 9 p.m.

couldn't do it. They bought a home nearby and friends kidded them that they lived in "Almost Ransom Oaks". One of our daughters lives near Raleigh, NC and met some young women from Grand Island. They knew about Ransom Oaks and were envious that she grew up here. Ransom Oaks is more than just a neighborhood, it has become a lifestyle that exhibits a strong



sense of community and history that past residents are proud to be a part of.

I remember when Ransom Oaks had a ski club. I remember when the pools used to have swim teams that competed in "swim meets" against each other. I remember arts and crafts events that kids were excited to participate in each year. How many of you still have a Ransom Oaks tie-dyed t-shirt? Others have described free golf lessons for Ransom Oaks children. Many of these activities have waned and I hope to reverse that.

Also, I have learned of many things that other communities do to create a stronger community. Our daughter's community outside of Raleigh is about half the size of Ransom Oaks but similar in many ways. The homes are about the same size, they have a community swimming pool and tennis courts. In addition they have a fair sized lawn area with a band stand. During the summer months they have "Saturday Movie Night in the Park" or "Friday Night Music" where they get local bands that are starting out and will play for little or no cost. Around dusk on these nights, the families all lay out their blankets on the lawn. The children all play together. There are food trucks, ice cream vendors and more. And, I did see more then one parent reach into a cooler and refill a cup from a distinctive bottle.

Our son lives in a community in Florida. It includes a banquet facility so they can have "Sunday Brunch". It is open to the public but sometimes residents get the first mimosa at no charge. Other activities include "Trivia Night", Halloween Costume Parade, Holiday Decoration Competition, Local Beer & Wine Tasting Sessions and you can't forget the Chili Cook-Off.

I don't know how many of these activities we can implement but I would like to try. Your Board is here to help the neighborhood succeed but we need residents like you to get involved. Together we can be committed to reinvigorating this great community and building on its already strong history. Please consider joining us at our next meeting on March 13 at 6:30 PM at the Greenwoods Meeting Room.


