Garage Sale Preparation

Having a garage sale can be fun and can put some money in your pocket, but to ensure success it takes proper planning. Here are some tips for making your sale more successful:

Be clear on the purpose of your sale. Are you selling things to make money or to get rid of them? This question affects everything you do, from how you price things to how willing you are to negotiate. Surprisingly, you can often make more money (and get rid of more junk) by pricing things low. As a general rule of thumb, price items about a quarter or third of what they would cost new. There are exceptions - clothes are generally poor sellers, unless it's baby/kids clothes.

Get Cash. Get a roll of quarters, a stack of twenty-five \$1 bills, and a few \$5 bills before the day of the sale. Also, wear an apron or fanny pack to keep your money safe and your hands free.

We are rapidly approaching another summer season. The tennis courts are all



open, the playgrounds are ready to go, and the pools will open Memorial Day weekend. We know that we have lots of work to get done before we can open the pools. Let's hope for some warm weather this month.

With the nice weather in sight, it is important for us to take time with our family and review the rules that must be followed at each of the sites. Rules are enclosed within this newsletter. Please note that again this year we will **open the Greenwood Facility at 9 o'clock** every day. This should accommodate the lap swimmers and early morning sunbathers. *Please note—this is not an open swim*--see the activities part of this newsletter for more information. It would also help the guards if an adult would accompany children the first few times to the pool. All children who have completed grades 1 through 3 will be required to pass a swimming test in order to be permitted in the pool area without adult accompaniment. Please sign in when you enter the pool area. Make sure you print your name and address legibly for safety concerns. You will be asked to show your tag each time you enter the facility the entire season.

Remember you will not be able to use any of the facilities until your assessment has been paid and you have received tags. The guards have been instructed that all people in the pool area must have pool tags. Please do not give the guards a tough time when they ask to see your tags.

Please remember that food needs to be consumed outside the pool area. All Ransom Oaks facilities are **smoke free**—this will be strictly enforced.

Let's hope for another summer of lots of beautiful weather!

Around Ransom Oaks Dangerous Chemicals

"A resident has asked us to publish this message. The Ransom Oaks board recognizes that scientists have not resolved the issues contained herein. Residents should review this and other material related to the subject."

It's finally spring time here in Buffalo; The sun is shining, the birds are chirping, and residents of Ransom Oaks and surrounding areas are looking to keep their lawns free of weeds.

What many are unaware of, however, are the toxic and long lasting effects these chemicals can have on our families. Chemical weed killers, fertilizers, and pesticides are putting our community, especially our children and pets, at risk for:

- Childhood Leukemia, Brain Cancer, Birth Defects, Disruptions in the Endocrine System
- Miscarriages
- Non-Hodgkins Lymphoma
- Liver and Kidney Damage; Just to Name a Few.

Children are at higher risk due to their fragile, developing systems which causes the effects of the poisons to multiply. Several Ransom Oaks residents, including one on the board, have been told by their veterinarians that their dog's cancer was caused by lawn chemicals. The chemicals are airborne, spreading from treated to untreated lawns. Avoiding them is impossible. After being outside with our children and pets, these harmful chemicals are brought into our homes where they end up everywhere.

These poisons are also contaminating our ground water, ponds, and harming our wildlife. Even if you don't drink tap water, it's quite unsettling that we are regularly washing our dishes and clothes, not to mention bathing, in water laced with pesticides. 96% of all fish studied in major streams and rivers contain one or more pesticide.

There are over 1200 homes in Ransom Oaks, most of which use pesticides. The decision each resident makes on lawn care greatly impacts the community as a whole. Cumulatively, we are exposing our children and pets to dangerous levels of chemicals.

The only way to ensure a healthier environment for our families is for us all to say "NO" to chemical lawn care and "Yes" to all Natural Chemical-Free care.

Many areas have banned these harmful chemicals, so why are they legal here? I believe that officials are pressured by large companies and many are fooled into believing that these chemicals are safe if you follow the application guide lines. If that were true, the studies which have been done on the effects of lawn chemicals would say they are safe. They in fact say the opposite. In addition, guidelines are often not followed.

The fact that these chemicals are legal does not lessen the harmful effects they have. Unfortunately, the economic revenue from these chemicals seems to be more important than the wellbeing of the consumer. Lawn care companies and distributors of lawn chemicals, like any business, want to make money. We have the opportunity to influence how many chemicals pollute our environment by purchasing only Natural, Chemical-Free lawn care. Businesses will begin to carry even more of the Chemical-Free products.

Together we can make a difference and set an example for other communities to make the switch to natural care. It is possible to have a beautiful lawn without using harmful chemicals.

Please call your lawn care provider and switch to all natural chemicalfree care or visit a local nursery for products such as 100% corn gluten meal (proven to naturally kill weeds and feed the grass). Get Cash. Get a roll of quarters, a stack of twenty-five \$1 bills, and a few \$5 bills before the day of the sale. Also, wear an apron or fanny pack to keep your money safe and your hands free.

Get Bagging Supplies.

Have a calculator handy. Make it easy for yourself to total items - price things evenly: .25, .50, and \$1, NOT .40, .75, \$1.20.

Prepare your staging area. People will be more inclined to stop if you set up shop in your yard or driveway.

Some people are reluctant to enter a dark and dreary garage. Make your sale inviting and easy to browse. You can lure customers by placing highly-desirable items near the road. Ever notice how hard a woman has to work to convince a man to stop at a yard sale? To solve this, set out an old lawn mower or power tools out front in plain view of the road, and you'll get more business. It's also smart to set up a small table with nothing but "man-things" (jars full of screws and nails, electronic parts, tools and parts of tools, etc.) This gives the men something to immerse themselves in while the women find all the real treasures.

Have an electrical outlet handy (or a long extension cord).

Be prepared as some buyers will expect you to bargain with them. If it's early in the morning and you don't want to bargain, just say "I think it's worth that price. I may lower the price later in the day if it doesn't sell.

Spring Highway Dept Updates

Starting April 1 residents can put out yard compost materials on their regular refuse day. The material must be properly bundled for pickup. In addition,

Amherst's annual spring brush pickup will begin on May 22nd. Pickup will follow the same weekly schedule as residents' refuse pickup regarding the day of the week. However it may take approximately two to three weeks for us to complete the whole Town.

Please have brush, logs and stumps out for pickup by this date. The Town will collect large unmanageable piles of logs, brush, and tree stumps only. All material must be placed out the start of that week.

We are going thru all areas of the Town one time only.

No mixed piles containing lumber, concrete, railroad ties or non-organic materials will be collected. Leaves, small trimmings and other yard waste should be put in containers, paper yard waste bags or bundled for collection by Modern Corporation on a weekly basis. **The Highway Department will not pick up these materials during this spring brush pickup.**
