By the time you get this letter Thanksgiving will have already passed and Christmas will be just a few short weeks away. The board wants to remind everyone that the **elections have been moved to April.** In the original offering documents the meeting was set for April. It was felt that spring would be a better time for the annual meeting

and elections. Our snow birds will be returning from their warmer winter reprieve, just in time to join those of us who endured the winter. We want to create an event where the community feels welcome and everyone will want to participate. More information will be forthcoming.

The board has not been content with the service that was provided by LMM. For that reason, the board has decided not to renew the contract. I want to thank Mary Fildes for stepping up to assist our board during the transition. Over time however, it became clear that our organizations were not a good fit. The board members are busy working to ensure we will have a successful 2018. Year-end budget numbers are being finalized. We are working with various contractors to get quotes so we can plan to repair and upgrade items that are critical, and develop a long term plan for those items we can't afford just yet.

At the November board meeting we still had an open board seat. We plan to have that seat filled by the time this newsletter is published.


