President's Update

The pool season has ended, and children are back to school. Please be patient when a school bus has to pick up students. Please don't rush past school busses on our community streets. There



may be other children in the street ahead crossing the road to get ready to their designated bus stop. Speeding by a bus greatly increases the chance of a tragic accident. Most bus drivers will let cars pass after a few stops. A little patience can enhance the safety for community streets.

We hope everyone enjoyed the pools, activities and other recreational facilities. The weekly ice cream socials, craft activities, movies under the stars, and mid-summer picnic were all well attended.

We made a commitment to the community to keep improving our facilities and to ensure high availability. Inevitably equipment will have problems on occasion, but the manager worked hard to get repairs completed quickly so that facilities would be back to full operation quickly.

Improvements were made at all the facilities. The most visible improvements were replacement of the heavily aged lounge chairs at all three pools, and painting of the bathrooms and concrete patio repairs at Eveningwood. The less visible repairs were to electrical, plumbing and improvements in safety equipment.

Into the fall we will continue to spruce up the Ransom Oaks and Eveningwood playgrounds. The board is working on long term plans to fix drainage issues at the Greenwood playground. The drainage issue must be addressed before we can move forward with improving the Greenwood playground improvements. The recreation committee is continuing to review and plan events throughout the Fall and Winter. Over the next two months, the board will be working with the management team to review major and minor maintenance that is desired. From that list we will again prioritize the project and develop and budget for 2019.

In the past 8 months there have been a variety of problems that have caused a great deal of delay and confusion regarding the payment of the yearly ROCC fee. Many checks went undelivered, but also did not return to the original sender. Complaints were made to the East Amherst and Buffalo main post offices. Since those complaints were made and the postal carrier was replaced, mail delivery appears to have improved significantly. There have also been numerous people who send their payment accidentally to the wrong HOA. In some cases the managers from the other HOAs were kind enough to forward the checks to ROCC, others HOA managers cashed the checks. The homeowner assumed they paid their yearly fee as the checks were cashed, but we never received payment. We also had either home owners who are not residents, or other people pay on behalf of home owners, but failed to note on their check what housing unit the payment was for. All these problems take a lot of time to investigate and resolve. The board in conjunction with the management team, is also looking at ways to improve the efficiency of collecting the yearly fee and the associated distribution of pool tags. More information will be forth coming in future newsletters.

We continue to look forward to working with community members, to continue make Ransom Oaks a great place to live.

Ransom Oaks Management Update

Part 1: What it means to live in a Home Owners Association



Whether you have lived here for 40 years or just moved in, we want you to feel at home in

Ransom Oaks. When we purchased our home here, 21 years ago this month, it took a short period of time to make the house our home and give it a style that was comfortable for us. But being a WNY transplant, it has taken years to establish a sense of Ransom Oaks being our home – home! Over the years, Ransom Oaks has connected us and transformed our circle of friends. From our first "get-to-know you" dinner invite at a neighbor's home, to meeting people at the pool, to raising a kid who participated in the community swim team program.

It is the Declaration of Ransom Oaks Community Corporation that creates the means, to maintain standards of community, that we all can live up to and expect from each other. It has become clear this year that many families have not received adequate information during their move to Ransom Oaks, or have lost sight of the advantages of living in a managed home owners association. Over the next few months, we will expand on this.

Ransom Oaks is a developed community that was established to provide recreational space for all residents to use at their pleasure. Guiding principles of this Home Owners Association are set forth in the ROCC Covenants and Restrictions document, which is provided to every new homeowner by their closing attorney. Ransom Oaks is guided by a volunteer Board of Directors to make critical decisions for the maintenance and long-term management of assets. Ransom Oaks is made of approximately 1150 residential units which includes hundreds of single family homes and 8 subcommunities made up of apartments, town houses and condominiums, which surround the Glen Oak Golf Course. Common grounds within the community offer 3 resident swimming pools, 3 resident kiddie pools, 5 tennis courts, 5 playgrounds and other managed lands.

Our community pools are the most obvious shared asset that many of us enjoy. The use of the facilities by residents can be a means to share a craft, skill or a social event. The Board of Directors and the management group have provided programming this past summer and we hope that you were able to enjoy one or more of those programs. From food trucks and ice cream socials to family movie night and arts and crafts, community members came out to enjoy what was offered. Please do not feel limited to what is offered. This is your community as well and we support any person or group that would like to host a community program utilizing one of the clubhouses or common properties. Next Month, we will host a Disaster Preparedness Program offered by the Department of Homeland Security. This will take place at the Greenwood Clubhouse on October 16, 2018 from 6pm – 7:30pm. In addition to that, food trucks will be scheduled as availability allows. We are seeking ways to communicate community schedule in real time. Current methods include the newsletter, website, Facebook and pool side chalkboard. If anyone has any ideas, please let us know.

Yard Waste Pickup -Apr 1st - Nov 30th

Each year from April 1st through November 30th your yard waste will be collected separately on your designated collection day. All yard waste must be placed within five feet of the curb, but not in the street. It must be separate from garbage and trash. Material must be placed in containers with two manufactured handles such as garbage cans or bushel baskets with covers removed. Yard waste totes are also acceptable. Containers must not exceed 60 pounds in weight or 40 gallon capacity. Yard waste will NOT be collected in plastic bags. Branches and shrub trimmings up to 6 inches in diameter should be cut into easily handled lengths, no greater than 4 feet even if placed in cans or securely bundled.
