President's Update

Fall is now upon us. The pools are closed, and all the equipment has been cleaned and put away safely and securely for the winter. The board is working with the managers to determine a



list of items that need to be repaired before winter and what needs to be repaired or upgraded in the spring before we open the pools again. Some of the repairs are cosmetic, others are upgrades required by the health department or equipment issues that were noted this year during the swim season. These requirements and any items on our wish list will drive the budget process.

Anyone walking near the Greenwood Tennis courts will note that there is now a giant pile of dirt behind it. The rear of the tennis courts has collapsed, and the rear fence is sagging as well. There was a sewer pipe that collapsed that is utilized by Forest Edge and Glenn Oak properties, but that line runs under ROCC property. The collapsed sewer was allowing soil to be washed way underground, causing issues with the drain tile under the tennis courts. This soil erosion underground also caused the back of the tennis court to collapse. The recent heavy rain caused this problem to accelerate dramatically over a 24 hour period of time. Repairs have been completed. The soil will need all fall and into spring to settle back down. Once we are into spring we can get the ground level out. We can then get the tennis courts and fence will be repaired as well. If we don't wait for the soil to naturally compact we risk future soil compaction and then both the tennis court and the fence might move again.

ROCC has two recreational facilities that need to be heated all winter long. We have some community members using them for personal parties or other events. We would like to see these buildings get utilized more by our community. If anyone is interested in starting social events such as game nights (could me specific card games or other games), craft events such as painting, book clubs, etc. If anyone wants to teach classes such as yoga or other activities that can fit within our building that would be welcome as well. We are looking for events that can bring together neighbors and make the winter months pass by in a more enjoyable way that is good for both the soul and body.

Part 2: What it means to live in a Home Owners Association(HOA)

Ransom Oaks Community Corporation is a New York not-for-profit corporation, created in 1972, for the purpose of ensuring the efficient preservation of the values and amenities in Ransom Oaks. As residents here, you are members of the Community Corporation. Annual assessments are necessary to maintain your assets and it is the owner's responsibility to make prompt payment. No owner is absolved of liability for the assessments by non-use of facilities or abandonment of home. Late payments will be charged late fees and non-payment can result in legal action against the owner.

In addition to your financial obligation to the community, Ransom Oaks owners have responsibilities to maintain their property in good order and repair. Living in an HOA provides us all protections and expectations so that we may treat all residents equitably. The Declarations list of restrictions can be found in Article IX of the Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions.

An architectural committee is a requirement of the Protective Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions of Ransom Oaks. It is incumbent on property owners to present plans to the committee regarding any proposed modifications to the exterior of their home. The Architectural Committee will review your submitted Exterior Modification Application (EMA form) and supporting documents to assess if the specifications meet with basic conformity of guidelines and compliance of the by-laws. This process ensures an independent review that can help to prevent inter-neighbor disputes over the characteristics of the neighborhood.



As a side note, many of you may have noticed work being conducted between Forest Edge and Glen Oak condos. There has been a sewer main break, that was repaired, and a storm drain that was cleaned out. This did cause structural damage to the adjacent tennis court, which is now closed. The details of these repairs and costs will be forthcoming, as the Board looks at insurance, budget and qualified tennis court restoration companies. Tennis courts at Ransom Oaks and Eveningwood will remain open until November 1st.
