President's Update



This month's notes are mostly a few important reminders.

First, **walking on golf course path is strictly prohibited** to anyone other than golfers. Please be a good neighbor to our gold course and don't trespass on their path. Being on the path with active golfers is extremely dangerous. If anyone needs a reminder of the power of a modern golf ball: at the recent Ryder Cup, a spectator was hit by a ball in the eye. That woman will be blind for life in the eye that was hit. It took just a brief second for the ball to go flying at her face, she did not have time to react and avoid getting hit.

Second, according to Amherst town rules, **dogs are required to be on leash when being walked**. A child was waking it's new puppy recently. The puppy was attached by another dog and the injuries were so severe that the puppy passed away. Please be a good neighbor and ensure that you have control of your dog when you are taking it out for a walk. This was a terrible event that I hope will never repeat again.

Third, all home owners that are not part of one of the other HOAs: You need **ROCC architectural approval for external changes** to a house. This includes painting the house a different color, replacing siding, replacing the roofing material, or any additions to the house. Every year we get questions regarding keeping the pools open past labor day. The board has looked into this issue and has come to the conclusion that this is not feasible. We have looked at the costs and labor to keep just one pool open. We have staffing limitations. Once the school year starts, all our lifeguards are back in school and their availability shrinks dramatically. If we were to open the pools only in the weekends, we would have to guarantee staff pay. The lifeguards don't want to commit to use and not get payed if the weekend ends up being too cold for swimming. Most are tied up either with school related issues or find alternative work after labor day. The pool needs to be cleaned daily, even if no one is swimming. Daily pool cleaning takes 2 to 3 hours every day. Evenings become much colder so we would have to use a lot of gas to heat the pools. Most years we have one or two warm weekends. The other two or three weekends end up being too cold for swimming. We would encounter thousands of dollars in cost for maybe 4 days of pool access. Given all these limitations and costs, it is not a good use of funds to extend the pool season beyond labor day.

Election Day in the U.S.

In the United States, Election Day is the day set by law for the general elections of federal public officials.



It is "the Tuesday next after the first Monday in the month of November" or "the first Tuesday after November 1".[1] The earliest possible date is November 2, the latest possible date is November 8.

For federal offices (President, Vice President, and United States Congress), Election Day occurs only in even-numbered years. Presidential elections are held every four years, in years divisible by four, in which electors for President and Vice President are chosen according to the method determined by each state. Elections to the United States House of Representatives and the United States Senate are held every two years; all Representatives are elected to serve two-year terms and are up for election every two years, while Senators serve six-year terms, staggered so that one third of Senators are elected in any given general election. Veteran's Day, Memorial Day, Armistice Day, Armed Forces Day Oh My!

Veteran's Day is an official United States public holiday, observed annually on November 11, that honors military veterans; that is, persons who served in the United States Armed Forces.

It coincides with other holidays, including *Armistice Day* and Remembrance Day, celebrated in other countries that mark the anniversary of the end of World War I; major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, when the Armistice with Germany went into effect. The United States previously observed Armistice Day. The U.S. holiday was renamed Veterans Day in 1954.

Veterans Day is not to be confused with *Memorial Day*, a U.S. public holiday in May; Veterans Day celebrates the service of all U.S. military veterans, while Memorial Day honors those who died while in military service. It is also not to be confused with *Armed Forces Day*, a minor U.S. remembrance that also occurs in May, which specifically honors those currently serving in the U.S. military.

in which presidential candidates are not on the ballot are referred to as midterm elections. Terms for those elected begin in January the following year; the President and Vice President are inaugurated ("sworn in") on Inauguration Day, which is usually on January 20.

Many state and local government offices are also elected on Election Day as a matter of convenience and cost saving, although it's not required.

Ransom Oaks Management Update

Part 3: What it means to live in a Home Owners Association

Grateful and thankful for the support to manage and work for Ransom Oaks. During this month of Thanksgiving, we want you to know what your neighbors have volunteered to complete this year. In addition to that, various improvements were required to: fix what was broken; meet Fire and Town codes; and Department of Health requirements.

This year we have had the support of dozens of volunteers who have collectively spent more than 300 hours:

- Approximately 20 volunteers worked for 3-4 hours in April, to create a field stone walkway to the Glen Oaks Playground, that according to one resident, was too wet for her grandchildren to access.
- Volunteers also planted 3 trees, as an earth day project to the surrounding playground area;
- For the Eveningwood bathrooms, which sustained some water damage from ruptured water lines last winter, several volunteers cleaned, repaired and painted the bathroom.
- Many of the members of the Board of Directors responded to the call of the ruptured water lines, spending countless hours getting water shut off, buildings dried up and winterized;
- residents assisted with arts and crafts, ice cream socials, movie nights and picnics;
- A Gardening Committee planned, purchased and planted dozens of roses, shrubs and grasses to give some of our islands a little color.

THANK YOU TO EVERYONE WHO WORKED AND SUPPORTED RANSOM OAKS THIS YEAR!

At all facilities, plumbing repairs were done to fix leaks caused from last year's frozen pipes. Critical electrical repairs and new fire extinguishers were added at all the facilities following a fire inspection. In order to meet fire code the clubhouses also were updated for capacity regulations, which both have a maximum capacity of 34 persons. Nonfunctional lighting was fixed at all facilities. The in-pools lights were replaced, and 20 new white lounger chairs were added to each pool deck. Chalk boards were added at all the facilities to provide daily updates to the community and pool participants. Spectrum internet and phone service have been installed at all the facilities for security purposes.

At the Eveningwood facility, the cracked and uneven concrete under the pavilion and in the garage was removed and a vast amount of drainage and new concrete was properly installed. Also added was a new concrete ramp from the pool deck into the pavilion. The loose tennis net center post has been driven back into the ground and hydraulic -cemented into



place. Interior painting was done throughout the bathhouse creating a brand-new and updated appearance. A new pool pump was installed for the Eveningwood baby pool as the bearings in the old pump had given out. The pool equipment plumbing was also nicely reconfigured.

At the Ransom Oaks facility, the playground received 95 bags of playground wood chip mulch. The leak that kept the baby pool closed all of summer 2017 was dug-up and repaired. A new baby pool pump was also installed, as the old pump was no longer operational.

At the Greenwood facility, major improvements to the main pool pumping system include a new high-efficiency pool water heater, and a new filter basket canister and shutoff ball valve were installed to replace the 1970's equipment that no longer functioned acceptably. Additionally, the pool plumbing was reconfigured to flow more directly and efficiently, and drywall was replaced in the pump room along with this work.

Selling Your Ransom Oaks Home

In our community there are steps when you sell your Ransom Oaks Home.

It is necessary for the seller to insure the following documents are made available to the buyer at closing:

A) Copy of the most current Ransom Oaks Covenants and Restrictions



B) Certificate of Compliance issued by Ransom Oaks Architecture Committee

C) Copy of the most current Certificate of Assessment, confirming that all your ROCC annual assessments have been paid in full and there are no arrears for any year.

To complete requirements for closing on your sale, ask your lawyer to contact 716-508-ROCC or facilitiesmanager@ransomoaks.com once your property is sold and a closing date has been established.

An exterior inspection will be performed to insure that your home and property are in compliance with all current covenants and restrictions. Once the inspection has been performed and your property is deemed to be incompliance and all assessments are up to date, we will forward the required documents to your attorney, who in turn will make them available to the purchaser at the closing.

We require 10 days notice to accomplish these tasks.


